

Work-Study Program

The Federal Work-Study program is a campus-based program that provides part-time employment for students who have been determined to have financial need. Upon completion of the FAFSA, students should contact the PCCUA Financial Aid office to see if they are eligible to participate in the Work-Study program.

Designed specifically for college students, the Federal Work-Study program allows your work schedule to revolve around your school schedule. The amount a student can earn per year is determined by financial need.

The jobs available are located primarily on campus, which allows you to work between classes without having to commute. You are not eligible for work study funding if:

1. You show no unmet need.
2. You are not making satisfactory academic progress.
3. We have exhausted our work study funds and have no more money to award to students.
In this case, you may ask to be put on a waiting list in case more funds become available.

Students are hired in Work Study positions by going through employment interviews with work study supervisors. Available Work-Study jobs are posted below as well as on the Federal Work-Study bulletin board outside the Student Testing / Work-Study office located in the Bonner Center. Students should contact the supervisor indicated on the job description to apply for the position. Upon hire, students should complete the Student Placement form with their supervisor and submit it to the Work-Study coordinator. If you are a first-time work-study, turn in the Student Placement form along with all required personnel documents.

Applications for employment with the PCCUA Federal Work-Study program are accepted without regard to age, race, gender, gender identity, national origin, disability, religion, marital or parental status, veteran status, genetic information or sexual orientation.
