 - Spring 2024, students will begin using ExamSoft for testing that will include NextGen items for the updated NCLEX PN
 - Spring 2024, adding ATI Medical-Surgical, Mental Health, and Community/Public Health Engage Series
 - Increase simulated real life bedside scenarios
 - Fall 2023 added daily assessments with Next Gen style questions
 - Fall 2023 added case studies to enhance critical thinking with simulation

 - Students retention of previously learned material
