Admission Requirements

A FULL-TIME or PART-TIME students seeking a certificate or an associate degree

- *1. Complete an Application for Admission** (which may be obtained from the Admissions/Student Services Office or via online at www.pccua.edu).
- *2. Provide scores from placement testing (ACT, ACCUPLACER, COMPASS).** Scores are used to determine placement in English, reading, and math. Students enrolling must submit ACT scores (19 or above on English/Reading/Math) or the equivalent on ACCUPLACER or COMPASS. PCCUA administers the ACCUPLACER test on a daily basis. Appointments may be made with Kalli Manis at (870) 946-3506 ext. 1607 (De Witt), Vickie Gregory at (870) 338-6474 ext. 1134 (Helena) or Sonya Allen at (870) 673-4201, ext. 1828 (Stuttgart).
- *3. Provide a copy of high school transcript or GED scores.** Must be an **official** high school transcript with graduation date and a stamped school seal, General Educational Development (GED) scores, and/or college transcript(s). Please request that the institution mail the transcript directly to the PCCUA Office of Admissions, P.O. Box 785, Helena, AR 72342. (If transcript is in a maiden name, please ask high school to indicate your current last name on form.) A request form may be obtained from the Admissions/Student Services Office or via online at www.pccua.edu.
- *4. Provide shot record.** Arkansas State Law requires all students born on or after January 1, 1957, to provide proof of immunity against measles, mumps, and rubella. Students must provide proof of two MMR vaccines against measles, mumps, and rubella.
- 5. Financial Aid.** Students applying for financial aid may contact Ronda Golden at (870) 946-3506 ext. 1607 (DeWitt), Kimberly Banks at (870) 338-6474, ext. 1358 (Helena), or Valerie Colvin at (870) 673-4201 ext. 1822 (Stuttgart). Students may also apply online at www.fafsa.ed.gov/.
- 6. Parking Permit.** Students parking on-campus are required to have an annual permit. This may be obtained at the Admissions/Student Services office.
- 7. Arrange for Payment.** Payment arrangements should be completed with the Business Office before the start of class.

B TRANSFER STUDENTS:

Note: Students transferring from another college or university must provide the following documents in addition to the requirements listed in section "A" above.

- Provide an official transcript from all colleges attended.** Transfer applicants should submit an official transcript from all colleges attended. Please request that the institution mail the transcript directly to PCCUA, P.O. Box 785, Helena, AR 72342. (If transcript is in a maiden name, please ask college to indicate your current last name on form.)

C PROVISIONAL STUDENTS not seeking a certificate or an associate degree:

- 1. Complete a PCCUA Application for Admission.**
- 2. For enrollment in a college-level Math or English course:** Provide results of ACT or ACCUPLACER testing along with a completed application.

Note: Provisional students are not eligible for financial aid. When a provisional student has completed a total of 12 credit hours or wishes to enroll in courses which will cause him/her to exceed 12 credit hours, he/she is no longer eligible to enroll in a provisional status. Prior to enrolling in courses which exceed the 12-hour limit, the student must complete all of the General Admission Requirements and be admitted to the College. After being admitted to the College, these students will be assigned an academic advisor and may continue to take courses without pursuing an award.

Financial Aid Resources at PCCUA



Pell Grants- Federal money available for students to help pay for their college costs. Visit your local campus financial aid office to complete a FAFSA or apply free online at fafsa.gov. Be sure to use the new IRS Data Retrieval Option Tool to load student and parent tax information onto the FAFSA.

State of Arkansas Scholarships- (Academic Challenge) – The Academic Challenge Program provides scholarships to Arkansas residents pursuing a higher education. Funded in large part by the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery, The Academic Challenge Scholarship is available to students regardless of their academic status, whether just graduating from high school, currently enrolled in college, enrolling in college for the first time, or re-enrolling after a period of time out of college. Eligibility requirements for the Academic Challenge Scholarship are based on two student categories: Traditional (Incoming Freshman) and Nontraditional students. Find the application at the ADHE website: sams.adhe.edu. Application deadline is June 1.

Arkansas Future Grant This scholarship is a “Last Dollar” state grant award that covers tuition and fees for qualifying certificate and Associate degree programs for eligible students. The grant applies to students enrolled in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) or regional high demand areas of study. Students must have graduated from an Arkansas high school, home school or received a high school equivalency diploma (GED) approved by the Department of Career Education; or Must have a high school diploma and have lived in Arkansas for the last three years immediately preceding application. This grant is available on a first come, first serve basis. Find the application at the ADHE website: sams.adhe.edu. Deadline to apply is July 1.

PCCUA Scholarships- Complete scholarship application. Be sure to follow all required steps. Return to campus scholarship office.

Single Parent Family Scholarship- (sponsored by Arkansas and Phillips County organizations) Provides financial assistance to single parents who are pursuing a course of instruction, which will improve their income-earning potential. Scholarships may be used for tuition, books, utility bills, car maintenance, child care, etc. Helena Campus students apply online at http://www.aspsf.org/county_phillips.html. Arkansas County students can apply online at http://www.aspsf.org/county_arkansas.html.

Career Pathways- (sponsored by ADHE) Qualified applicants must be a parent or legal guardian of a child under 21 years of age; must be receiving Transitional Employment Assistance (TEA) now, or have received TEA in the past; be receiving SNAP, Medicaid, or ARKids; have earnings that fall below 250% of the federal poverty guidelines. - Attend 4 years at an Arkansas or Phillips County high school.

- Have no drug or DUI offenses.
- Exhaust all other scholarships or financial aid programs first. State of Arkansas scholarship deadline is June 1.
- Must enroll fall semester following high school graduation.
- Must be accepted as a PCCUA student, attend either the Helena or DeWitt Campuses, and complete a PCCUA scholarship application.

Once at PCCUA

- Enroll for at least 12 credit hours per semester the first year and 15 credit hours per semester the second year. (DeWitt and/or Helena Campuses only).
- Exhaust all other scholarship and financial aid programs first.

- Successfully complete at least 67 percent of all credit hours attempted each semester.
