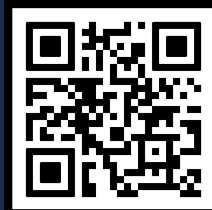

FINANCIAL AID

**Financial Need:** Financial aid is awarded to students who show financial need and who are maintaining satisfactory progress as defined by the institution.

How to Apply:

1. Complete a Free Application for Federal Student Financial Aid (FAFSA). These are available at all three campuses or online at [www.studentaid.gov](http://www.studentaid.gov).
2. Students must complete the FAFSA online and dependent students must have parent consent.
3. Students must check their workday accounts daily to check the status of their financial aid.
4. All students must complete a Student Data form located in the Financial Aid office on each campus.
5. If you are attending PCCUA classes for the first time and you are eligible to receive federal financial aid, you will need to submit the following information:
  - a copy of your high school transcript or GED, OR a copy of your most recent college academic transcript; If Eligible for Financial Aid:

If Eligible for Financial Aid:

- If you are eligible for financial aid, you will receive an Award Letter from the PCCUA Helena-West Helena campus financial aid office;
- PCCUA staff will submit your awards form to the Business office.
- If the amount of the award letter is greater than the cost of tuition and books, the balance is paid to you in two payments.
- Remember: Students who withdraw from classes may be required to repay federal dollars.

G.I. BILL-VETERANS BENEFITS

**Veterans (GI) Benefits:** The Arkansas State Approving Agency approves some programs at PCCUA for veteran training. Veterans of recent military service, service members, members of reserve units, and dependents of certain other veterans may be entitled to educational benefits under the following programs: Post 9/11 GI Bill Chapter 33; Title 38, Chapter 30, Montgomery GI Bill for Veterans; Title 38, Veterans Education Assistance Program (VEAP); Title 38, Chapter 35, Survivors and Dependents Education; and Title 10, Chapter 1606, 1607, Montgomery GI Bill for Selective Reserves. Students must be working toward a degree following curriculum outlined for their objectives.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Academic scholarships are offered to first-time, full-time students with an ACT composite of 23 or 3.0 high school GPA.

Technical scholarships are offered to first-time, full-time students with a 23 ACT composite or 3.0 GPA in high school curriculum. Students must enroll in a technical program.

Foundation scholarships are available to students from the generous support of community donors. Phillips and Arkansas County high school graduates (Helena and DeWitt campuses only) are eligible for the Great River Promise. Students who meet the stated criteria will be able to attend Phillips Community College with college tuition and mandatory fees paid.

**Criteria (beginning with 2010 graduates)**  
Attend 4 years at an Arkansas or Phillips County high school; graduate with a high school diploma; achieve high school attendance requirements for 4 years of high school; have no drug or DUI offenses; must enroll fall semester following high school graduation; be accepted as a PCCUA student and complete a PCCUA scholarship application and exhaust all other scholarship and financial aid programs first. Deadline for the State of Arkansas scholarships: June 1.

Once at PCCUA

Enroll in at least 12 credit hours per semester the first year; enroll in 15 credit hours per semester the second year; scholarship is for 4 semesters (during a period not to exceed 3 calendar years) following fall semester after high school graduation; successfully complete at least 67% of all credit hours attempted each semester; maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA.

Arkansas Transfer Achievement Scholarship



The University of Arkansas, Fayetteville, (UAF), has a scholarship that reduces tuition rates for students, who graduate with an associate's degree from PCCUA and then transfer to the Fayetteville campus.

Earn an associate's degree from PCCUA, then transfer to UAF to work towards a bachelor's degree and pay the **same basic credit hour tuition** paid at PCCUA.



**PCCUA Rate = \$77/credit hour;**  
**transfer to UAF = \$77/credit hour**

To be eligible to receive an Arkansas Transfer Achievement Scholarship, a graduate must:

- Be an Arkansas resident
- Earn an associate's degree (AA, AS or AA in teaching) from PCCUA
- Complete degree at PCCUA the semester prior to enrolling in UAF on-campus program
- Have a cumulative 2.0 grade point average, renewable for up to 10 semesters
- Meet all other U of A admission criteria and program requirements
- Enroll in an on-campus undergraduate degree program, full or part-time

This scholarship applies to the base tuition at UAF, and recipients will still be required to pay all applicable fees, as well as any differential tuition above the base rate charged by programs.
