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CO-CURRICULAR ASSESSMENT OVERVIEW

Per the previous HLC Review Notes, PCCUA has been diligently working to capture the student experience of being involved in organizations, student activities, service learning, etc. to foster students' overall learning development.

PCCUA Student Services is committed to improving the educational experience of all students through the implementation of assessment to gauge how effective our efforts are in meeting the needs of the students, while influencing a positive impact on student development and students' educational experience. We value and understand that student perception is heavily influenced by (1) students' beliefs and (2) their expectations about what the experiences should be at the college. Hence, the importance of gathering information regarding the student experience.

Through the compilation of campus assessments and reporting, PCCUA will become more informed about the impact the institution is having on students, the community, and reflect the contribution of campus members to the college's mission to help every student succeed.

CO-CURRICULAR DEFINITION

PCCUA co-curricular assessment considers formal and college-sponsored activities that contribute to students' educational experiences, such as Student Advising, Student Government Association, Student Clubs and Organizations, Athletics, programs, and services that support the mission of the college, strategic goals, and the General Education Core Competencies.

ASSESSMENT GOALS

The goal of the co-curricular assessment is to improve the quality of services and resources to ensure student success. The assessment seeks to answer two questions:

Are students learning what we intend for them to learn?

How can co-curricular programs be improved to further support, inform, or advance student knowledge.

CO-CURRICULAR ASSESSMENT TEAM

The Co-Curricular Team is comprised of a variety of student service areas across campus to represent areas that receive the most student engagement. The Co-Curricular Team assists in guiding assessment and future planning. The staff membership is permanent, but when the need arises, appropriate personnel is invited to serve as ad-hoc members to provide additional insight.

CO-CURRICULAR LEARNING OUTCOMES

Student learning outcomes are defined in terms of knowledge acquisition, skill development, and continual improvement in student progression due to active learning that has occurred as a result of participating in an activity, program, or service. The co-curricular assessment plan supports the college's strategic plan, the mission of Student Services and is aligned with the college's general education core competencies.

METRICS

The Co-Curricular Assessment uses mixed data metrics to formulate a richer, more comprehensive account of the student experience:

Direct measures of learning derived from observation of participation in activities or programs.

Direct measures of learning through attendance tracking.

Direct measures of learning through students demonstrating skills.

Indirect measures of learning via written reflections and learning outcome statements.

Direct measures of learning through in-person presentation and e-portfolios.

PROJECTIONS

The Co-Curricular Assessment provide a comprehensive journey for PCCUA students, with the goal of providing quality activities, programs, and services to support and educate the students. The campus will work together to ensure student success, access, and engagement through continual monitoring and revisiting and evaluation of our efforts. Please note that this report is a living document and was created with flexibility in mind; thus, allowing for changes to be made based on opportunities that may arise to further develop student learning at PCCUA.

ASSESSMENT PLANNING

Service Departments that focus on student support maintain an assessment plan that reflects activities, learning goals, measurable outcomes, a time-line for implementation, methods, and the execution of changes based on assessment findings.

Each service department that provides student support will complete a departmental review on a yearly basis to improve the quality and delivery of service. The process will involve the identification of services, programs, or initiatives that promote student learning, discuss better methods for student engagement, and gathering data to better understand and communicate about the student experience. Reports are due no later than June 30th of each year.

If findings of the assessment reflect that the desired standards of operations are not being met then interventions will be revised and executed. Changes will be documented via a new assessment plan.

ASSESSMENT REPORTING

Campus reporting will include any planned co-curricular activities in the annual assessment plan. If a co-curricular activity is not included in an annual assessment plan, it is recommended that a Co-Curricular Activity Proposal be submitted at the conclusion of the event to the Vice Chancellor for Student Services and Campus Life.

ASSESSMENT PROCESS

Step One: Planning

The Co-Curricular Assessment Chair contacted specific personnel to educate them on the co-curricular assessment process and explain the importance of co-curricular assessment regarding student success, support, and belonging at the institution. Each person in attendance left the session understanding how they could participate in the process and improve their services, as well as make their interaction with students more meaningful.

Step Two: Assessing

Survey questions were based on specific themes including student support, satisfaction, knowledge acquisition, and personal development.

Step Three: Evaluate

The results from the assessment will be analyzed by responding to questions regarding key findings, information gained through the assessment, identify success and opportunities for change, and create plans of action to execute change.

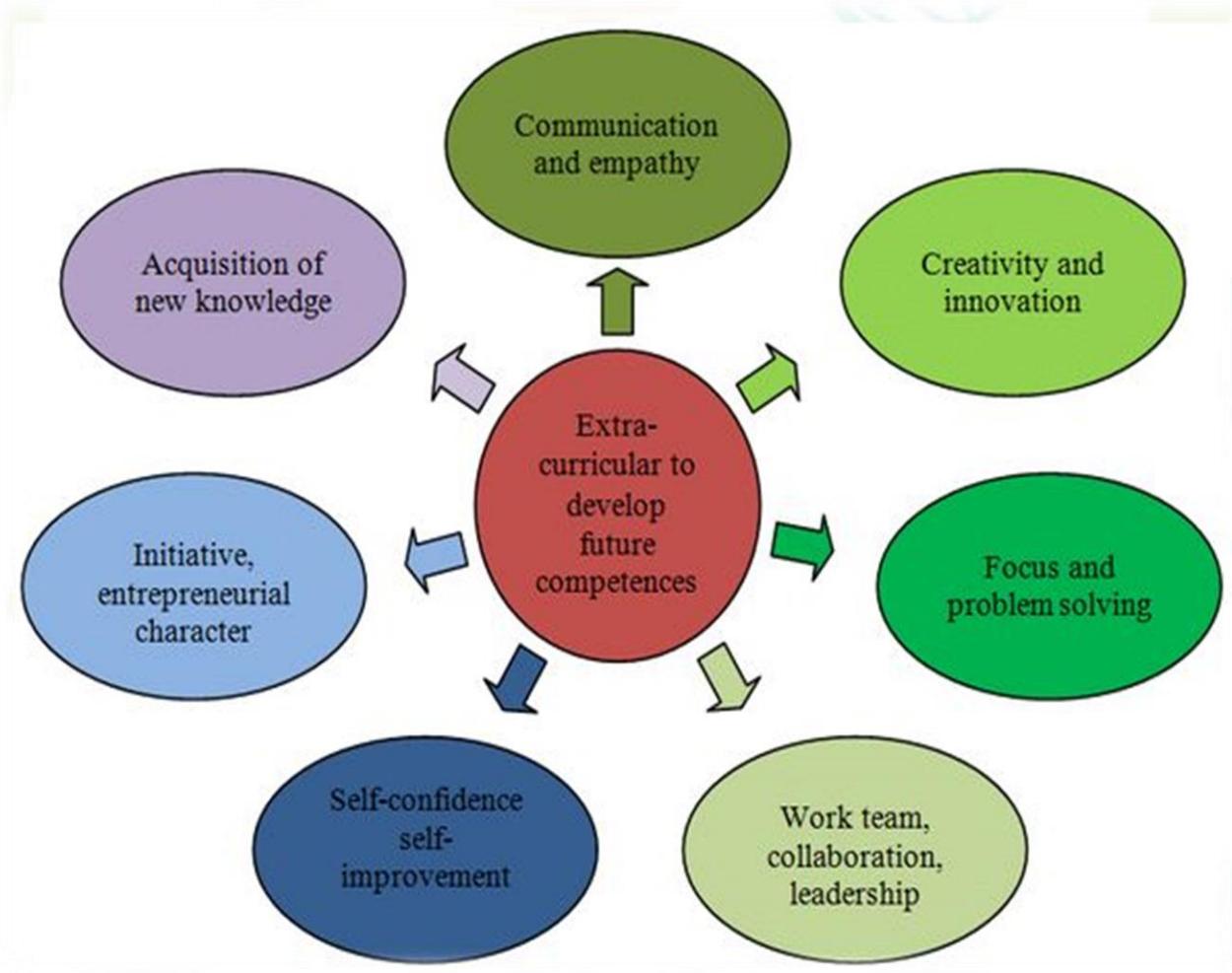
Step Four: Assess Actions

After recommendations and steps have been made to improve programming and services, evaluation will continue and all information will be documented for future improvement.

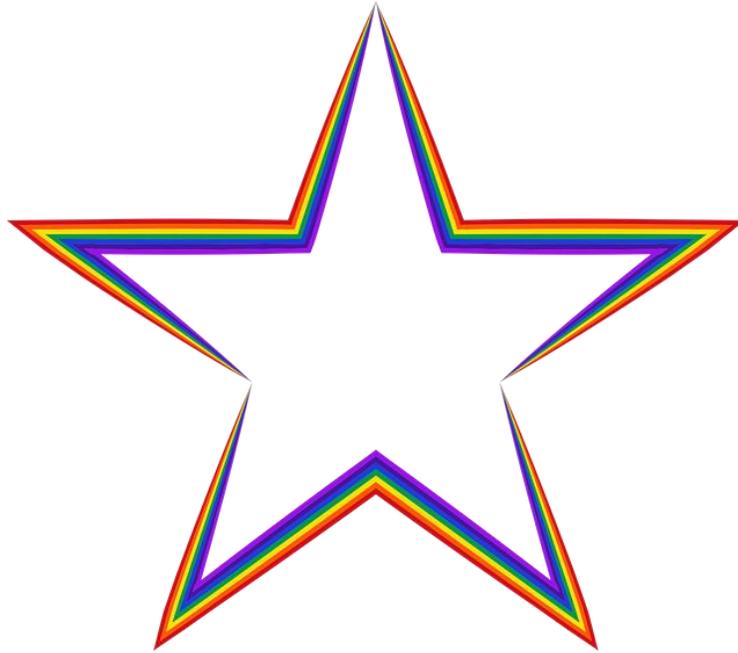
CONCLUSION

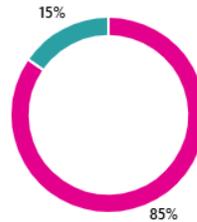

Eligibility for the program includes being a first-generation college student, meeting the federal low-income guidelines, as noted by the Department of Education, or having a documented disability. The Academic Services and social support provided by the program greatly impact students' persistence and retention.

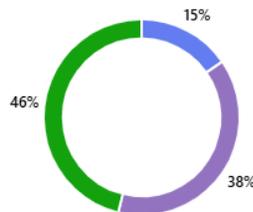

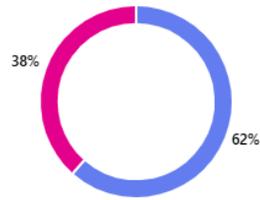
2. Student Support Services helped develop knowledge and skills to improve student success.

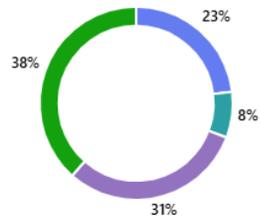
3. Student Support Services supported me in navigating barriers in my educational journey.

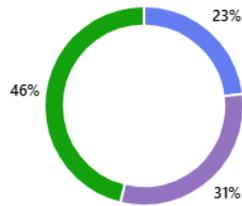
4. Student Support Services helped me to manage my well-being.

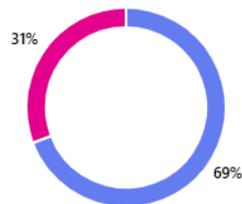
5. Student Support Services contributed to a stronger sense of belonging at the college.

6. Student Support Services provides a welcoming and inclusive environment.

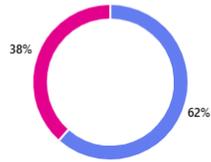

8. What do you like best about being in Student Support Services?

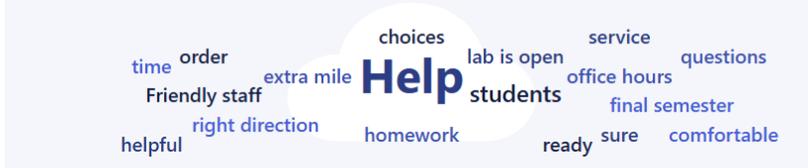

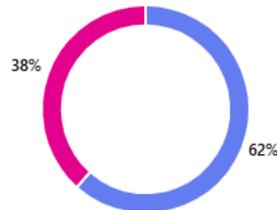

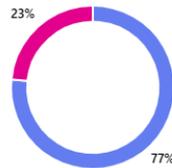

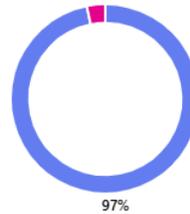

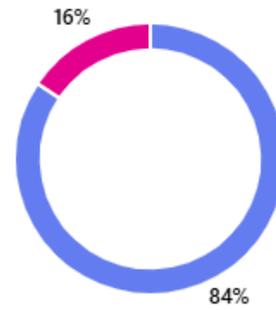

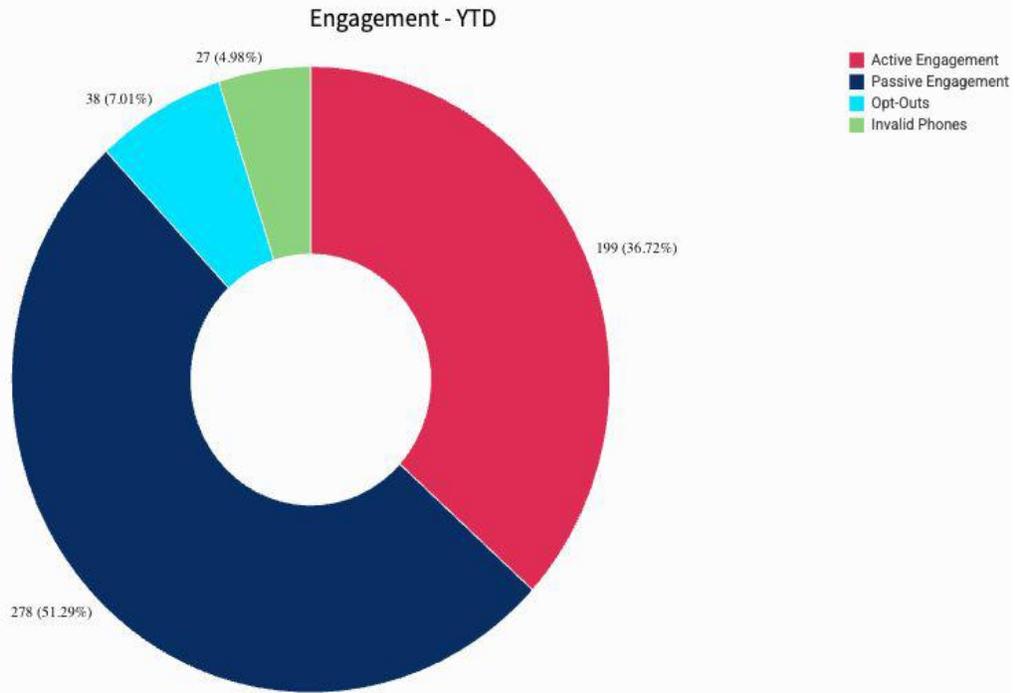

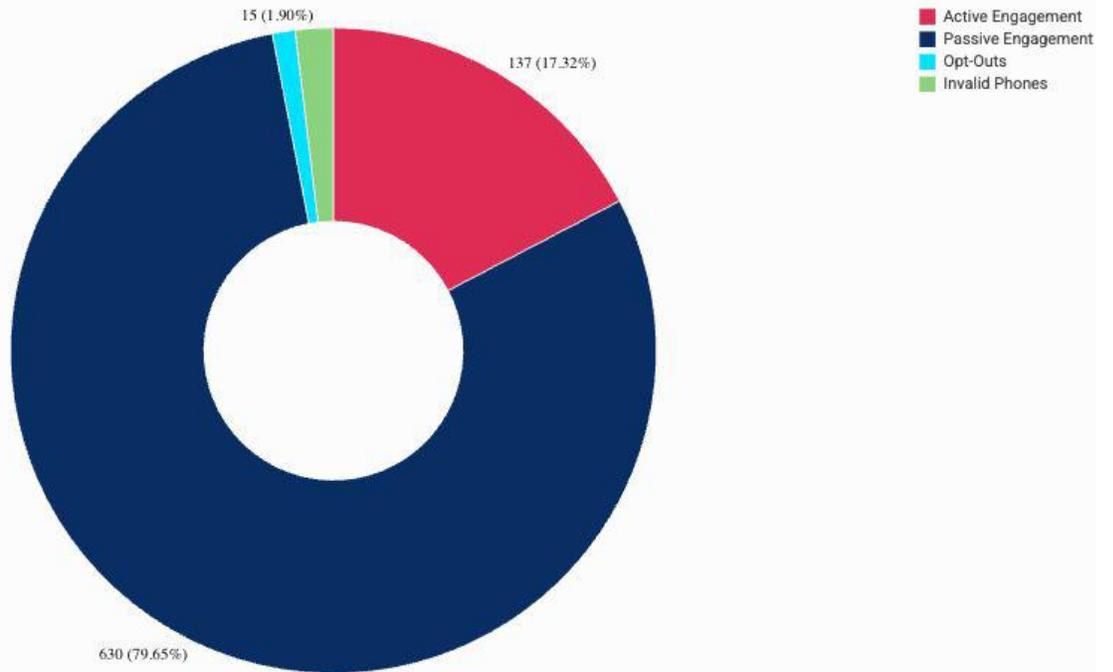


Engagement - YTD



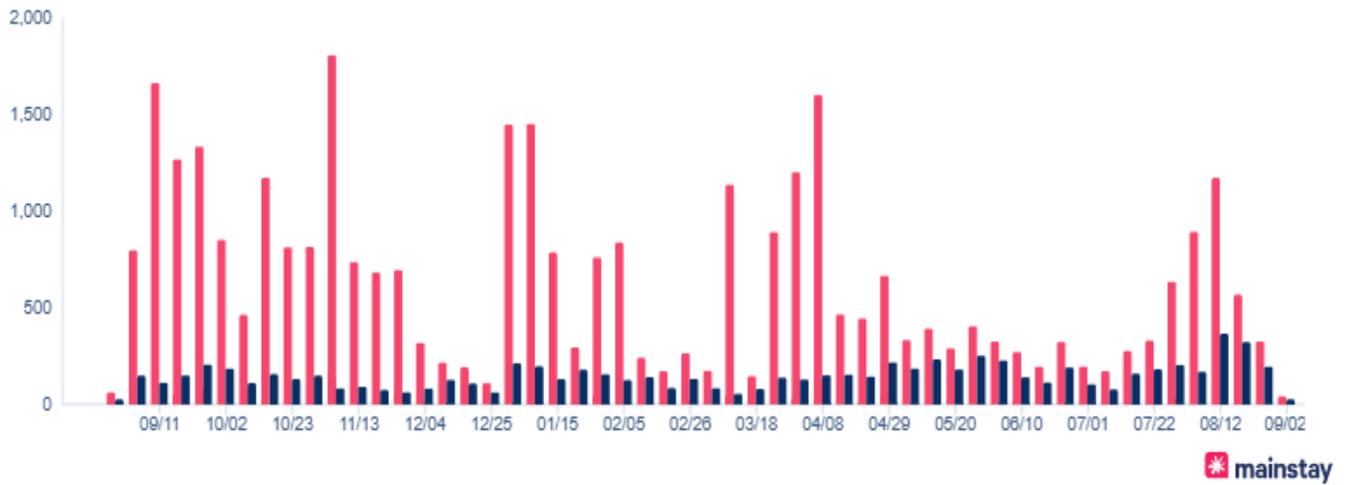

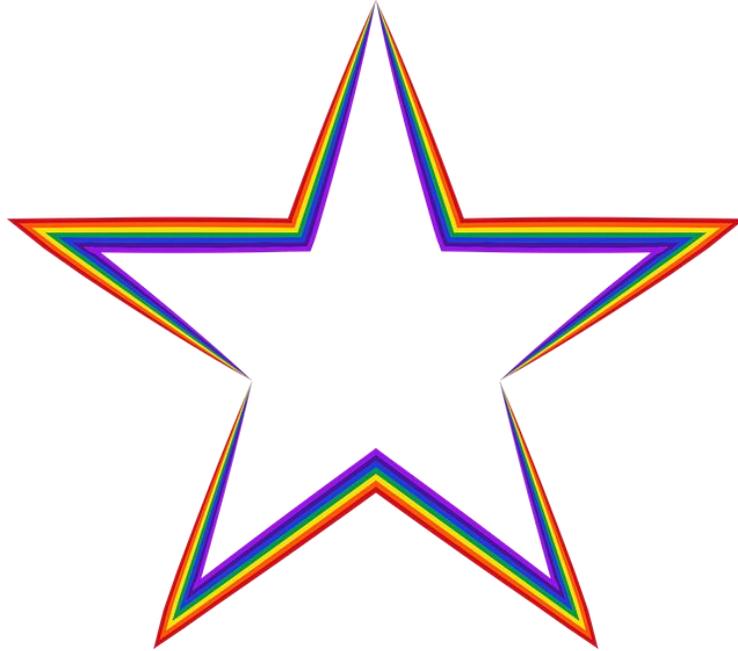
Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSE)

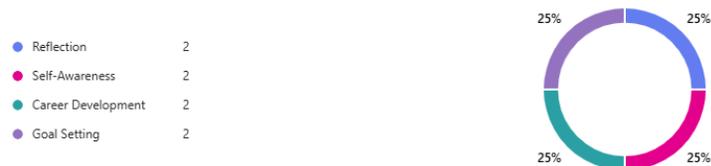

PCCUA is committed to continuously improving the educational experience of our students. Co-Curricular assessment for student organizations involves evaluating the effectiveness of activities and programs that contribute to students' personal, social, and professional development. These activities focus on critical thinking, cultural awareness, communication, and self-development.

Student Learning Outcomes

Through participation in this case study, students were able to articulate their knowledge, values, attitudes, problem solving skills, and display application of knowledge.

Here's a Case Study that supports differences in people. Students take the time to review and send me your responses.

Case Study 1:

Nora is an Autistic second-year CSD graduate student getting ready to start her first placement. She's passionate about working with adults in acute care settings and intends to work in a hospital after graduation. She excelled in her medical-focused courses, like dysphagia, and is eager to apply what she's learned in a clinical setting.

When the semester began, the majority of Nora's peers had placements lined up, but she was disappointed to find out she didn't. Nora met with her professor, the clinical coordinator, and was told that she wouldn't be able to place Nora in a medical setting because the clinical supervisors were, "not comfortable taking on a student with a disability." Her professor explained, "someone like you should consider other options" because Nora wouldn't be able to "keep up" in a fast-paced medical setting or develop the counseling competencies needed to effectively work with patients and their families.

Upset, Nora turned to her friend Andre and disclosed what happened. She believed that her professor was unfair and that she was being underestimated because she is Autistic. Andre understood where Nora was coming from, but told her that she should trust that their professors have students' best interests in mind. Plus, Andre thinks to himself, they've placed hundreds of students over the years and probably have a good sense of what each student is capable of.

Discussion Questions

1. What biases are present in this scenario?
2. What hidden insult, or microaggression, did the clinical coordinator make towards Nora? How are microaggressions like this harmful?
3. What skills would help him better navigate this situation?
4. As a student leader, what's one action you could take to promote equitable opportunities for students of all abilities in the future?

Case Study #2

Chen is a first-year college student that feels excluded or misunderstood in the learning group that his instructor placed him in. He doesn't like to work in groups, but he knows that he has no choice in the matter. He begins to feel anxiety because he believes that it will have challenges of navigating different cultural perspectives and communication styles while adjusting to a new environment. Chen's fears were realized during the group discussion on Monday, he felt that his contributions were overlooked or dismissed by the group members, particularly Mark, who seemed to dominate the discussion with his own perspective.

Chen feels uncomfortable voicing his concerns, fearing that his thoughts would not be viewed as valid, or that the group members would think that he is being "too sensitive" or may not understand due to his cultural background. Please help Chen by creating action steps to address her concerns.

1. How can students actively listen and try to understand viewpoints different from their own?
2. How can Chen strategically advocate for his perspectives within the group while maintaining positive relationships?
3. How can Mark be more mindful of his communication style to create a more inclusive environment?
4. How can other group members support Chen?
5. What role can the instructor play in ensuring everyone feels heard and valued?
6. What campus resources on campus can support this student?

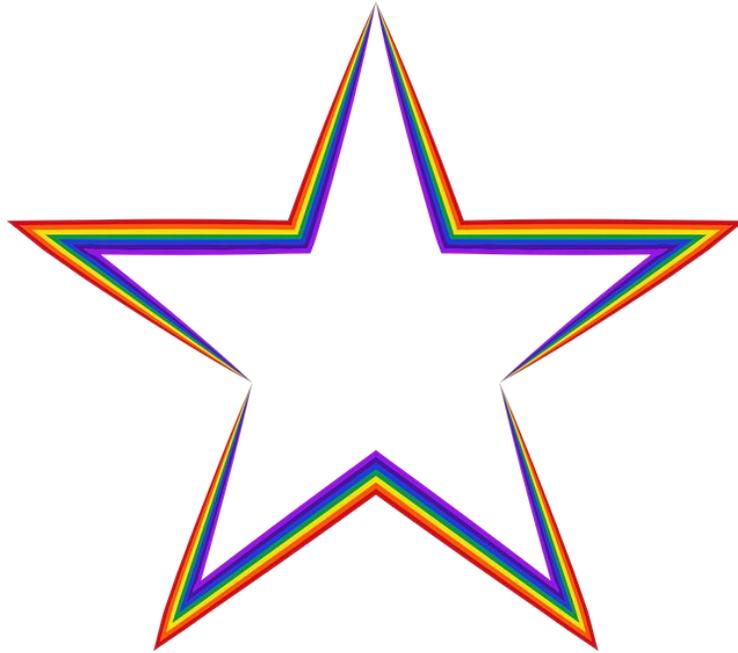

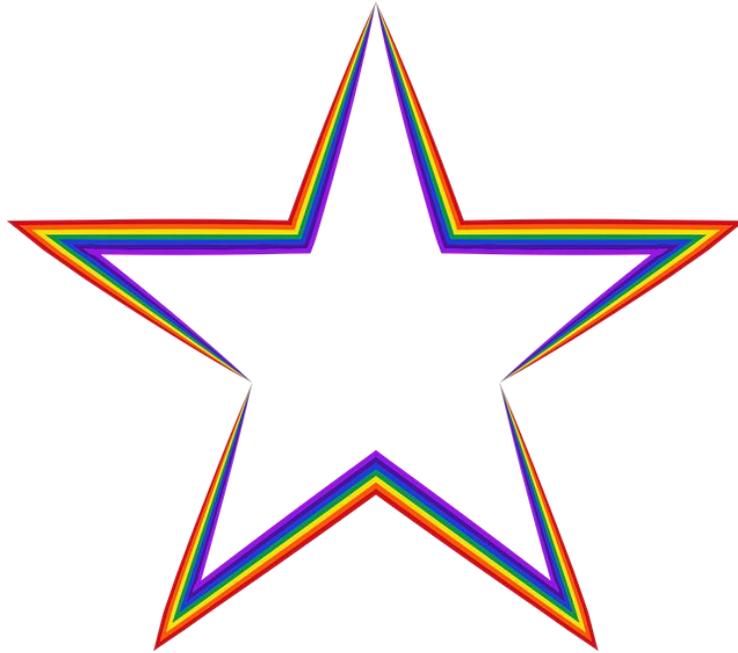

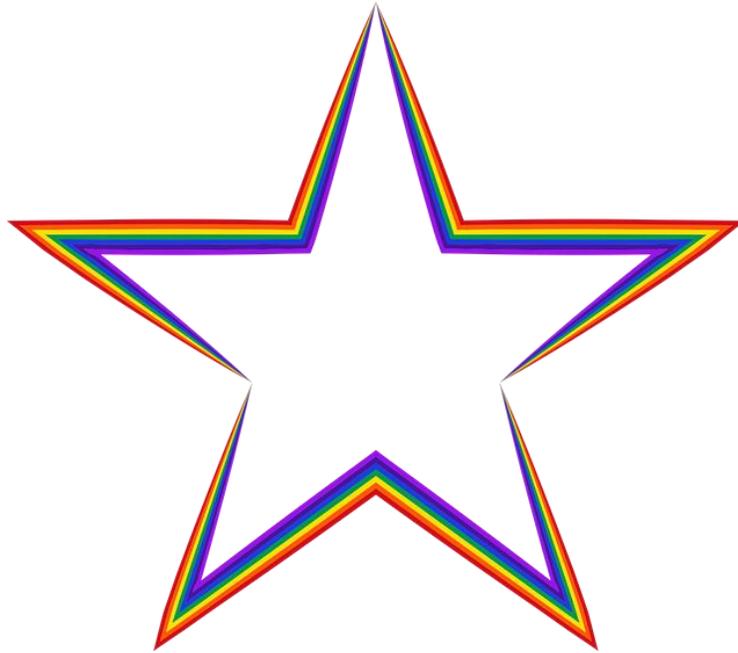

The Arkansas Career Pathways Initiative is a comprehensive project designed to improve the earnings and postsecondary education attainment of Arkansas’s low-income Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)-eligible adults. The initiative provides funding for two-year colleges to assist TANF-eligible adults to earn a marketable, educational credential for immediate entry into a high demand occupation. The initiative fosters strong connections among two-year colleges, students, community organizations, state agencies, and employers.

Eligibility requirements include the following:

- Custodial or noncustodial parents of a dependent child residing in Arkansas and under the age of 21, and whose income is less than 250% of FPL. This includes custodial and noncustodial parents, parents who are justice-involved (currently or previously incarcerated), or minor parents who are not head of household.
- Current (or former) TEA, SNAP, Medicaid or ArKids whose income is less than or equal to 250% of FPL guidelines.

Key Aspects of the Assessment

- **Career Readiness:**
Gathering data on the impact of career preparation for the improvement of the program - job readiness and basic academic skills, and post-secondary credentials tied to high-wage, high-demand occupations.
- **Adequacy:**
Developing assessment methods to measure the learning outcomes of the program to ensure that the program services meet the educational goals of the student, as well as the workforce.
- **Well-being:**
Through data collection, personnel will be able to identify opportunities for support and improvement of student learning.

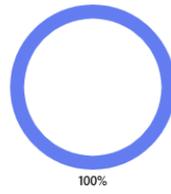

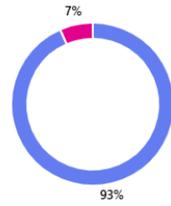

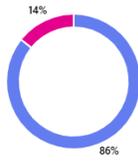

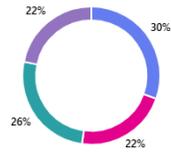

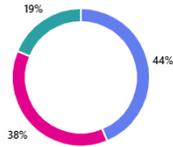

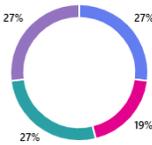

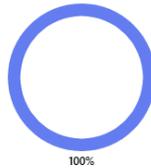

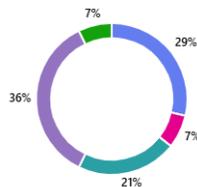

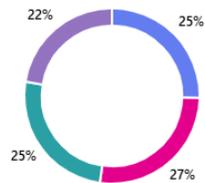

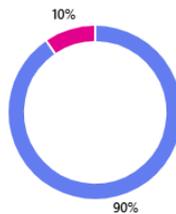

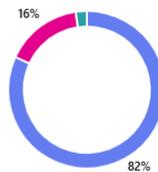

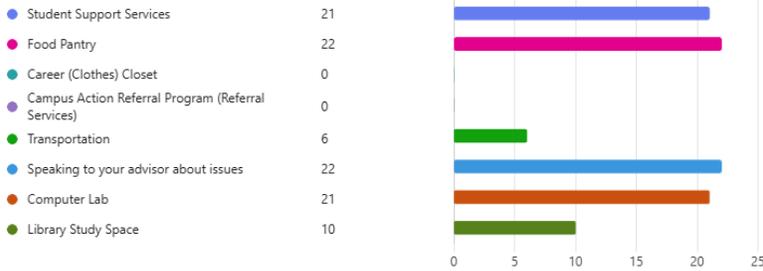

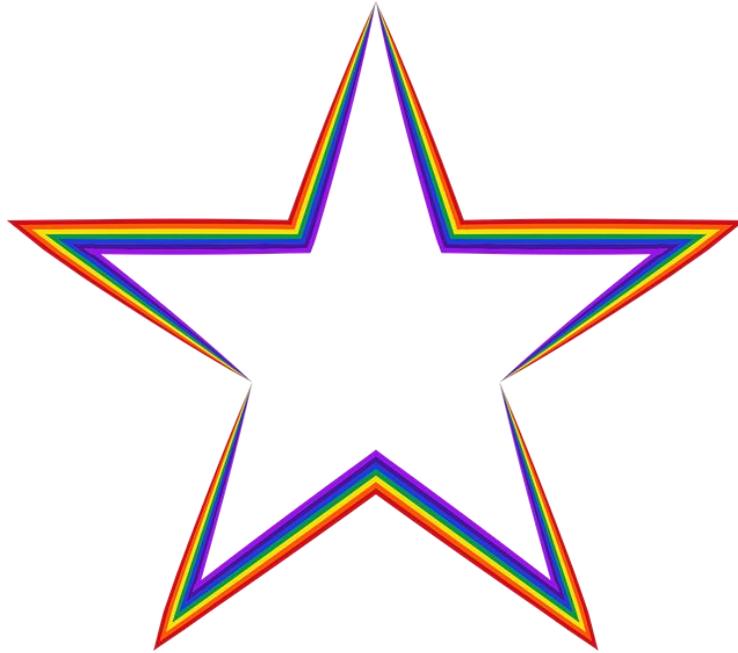
