Students receive applicable knowledge of criminal justice systems and operations and explore local, state, and federal law enforcement, judicial processes, corrections and security services. The program is a study of criminal justice systems, criminology, juvenile justice, criminal and constitutional law, investigative principles, ethics and community relations all integrated into the curriculum.
