Student Support Services

The Student Support Services (SSS) program is one of the federal TRIO programs at Phillips Community College of the University of Arkansas and is funded 100% by the United States Department of Education. The program is designed to :

- Increase the retention and graduation rates of eligible students,
- Increase the transfer rate of eligible students from two-year to four-year institutions and
- Foster an institutional climate supportive of the success of low-income and first-generation college students and individuals with disabilities.



The Goal

The program provides opportunities for academic development, assists students with basic college requirements and serves to motivate students toward the successful completion of their postsecondary education. The goal of SSS is to increase the college retention and graduation rates of its participants and help students make a transition from one level of higher education to the next.

Services

Services that are provided to participants through the SSS program include:

- Academic advising and course selection
- Financial aid counseling and assistance
- Financial literacy
- Transfer information and assistance, including college visits
- Instruction in study skills
- Career exploration
- Peer and computer-assisted tutoring
- Advocacy with staff and faculty

These services are provided free of charge to SSS participants.



Who is Eligible

A student is eligible to participate in the SSS program if the student meets all of the following requirements:

- Is a citizen or national of the United States or meets the residency requirements for Federal Student Financial Assistance,
- Is enrolled or accepted for enrollment in the next academic term at PCCUA,
- Has a need for academic support in order to pursue successfully a postsecondary educational program, and is:
 - A low-income individual,
 - A first generation college student, or
 - An individual with disabilities
